### Draw a Cylinder

- Draw an oval at the top of your page (this will be the top of your soup can).
- 2. Draw a straight (vertical) line on each side of the oval for the sides of the can.
- Connect the two vertical lines with a little curved line at the bottom.


### You now have a cylinder.



How to draw a cylinder **Step-by-Step** 

## Turn this cylinder shape into a Warhol-inspired soup can using the following steps.

- Draw a small circle in the middle of the can.
- 2. Add a curved line that goes through the middle of this small circle (much like the bottom line in step 3 above) but skip over the circle.
- Add a smaller oval inside the first oval that you drew (the top of the can).
- 4. [Optional] Write Campbell's Tomato Soup (or any flavor you want) on your can.




